Teaching the dharma

Master Kosen (1950–2025), 83rd patriarch of Zen Buddhism, was the successor and heir of the dharma of Master Taisen Deshimaru. The teaching now continues with the certified masters of the Kosen Sangha: Pierre Soko Leroux, Christophe Ryurin Desmur, Loïc Kosho Vuillemin, Paula Reikiku Femenias, Ingrid Gyuji Igelnick, Françoise Jomon Julien, Ariadna Dosei Labbate, Toshiro Taigen Yamauchi, Richard Kosen Féret, Frédéric Senki Gruau and Paul Dokusan Loomans, together with Master Barbara Kosen, codisciple of Master Kosen, and the senior disciples of the sangha.

Leave the Castle and Enter the Mountain. Master Kosen's temple stands in the Regional Park of Haut Languedoc, among the Caroux mountains, a magnificent and unspoilt place at 800 metres altitude. Two rivers and many forests surround it; it has become a major centre of Zen practice in Europe.

Sesshin

Sesshin means "touching the spirit". Participants in these spiritual retreats live at the rhythm of the zen temples: several zazen periods a day, meals and traditional ceremonies, as well as samu. Beginners, monks and nuns alike deepen their zazen practice there under the guidance of a teacher. Arrive the evening before the session, from 18 h. Preparation samu starts at 18 h.

Registration and payment

Register at least one week in advance at zen-deshimaru.com. Payment:

The summer camp

In Japan, Ango refers to a tradition dating back to the Buddha's time. It was a period of shared practice that brought the whole Sangha together around the Buddha during the summer rainy season.

- A period of preparation lasting 5 days, a day off, then a sesshin (period of more intensive practice).
- Teachings in the dojo (kusen).
- Samu: zen kitchen, garden, maintenance, sewing of the kesa (the robe of nuns and monks).
- Various related activities: yoga...

You arrive on the evening before each session. A session ends on the last day after lunch.



Permanent staffers at the summer camp

'Permanent staffers' are involved in the organisation and running of the entire camp. They arrive the day before the camp starts and leave the day after it ends. To join the team of permanent staffers, send an e-mail to contact@zen-deshimaru.com at least one month before the beginning of the camp.

By public transport

The nearest town accessible by public transport is Lamalou-les-Bains. The bar *Le Belleville* is a meeting point for carpooling. Buses serve Lamalou from Montpellier (Mosson station, see tam-voyages.com) or from Bédarieux (station). You can reach Bédarieux by train or bus from Béziers station. See rome2rio.com.



Carpooling

After registering for an activity, the confirmation e-mail gives you access to app.caroster.io to organise and share your journeys.

By car

Via the D 908 road (Orb valley, between Saint-Pons and Bédarieux). Via Hérépiant: take the D 13 towards Saint-Gervais-sur-Mare, turn left towards l'Horte, then right onto the D 22 as far as the Col de la Pierre Plan-tée. Then follow Rosis, pass through the village and follow the direction of Douch. After the hamlet *Le Cabaret*, a sign on the right indicates the temple. See tinyurl.com/templecaroux.

Car park

Do not park right at the entrance to the buildings. To keep access clear, after unloading your luggage, go back up the dirt track and park your vehicle in the car park, on the left of the road to the hamlet of Douch.

Samu

Samu means *doing things* and *things to do*. Work for the temple and the community is an integral part of the practice.
